Job Purpose: To deliver support within the classroom and provide 1:1 maths

lessons as required to pupils across Years 7-13.

Reporting to: Head of Learning Development/ SENDCo

Hours: 3/4 days per week

Your Professional Duties

You are expected to act in accordance with the aims, policies and administrative procedures of the school. The following duties shall be deemed to be included in the professional duties which you will be required to perform.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities

- Deliver 1:1, pair or small group support lessons to pupils across Years 7-13.
- Set high expectations for pupils' behaviour whilst fostering a safe and supportive atmosphere for pupils who struggle with Maths.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- Provide alternative pathways for pupils to achieve their full potential in Maths.
- Provide a multisensory approach to teaching Maths.
- Be aware of Maths misconceptions and how to support pupils.
- Understand the development of Maths and the methods used at Primary (KS2).
- Investigate and implement the use of alternative teaching methods to those used in the classroom.
- Support pupils with a range of neurodiversity (knowledge of dyscalculia and how to support maths anxiety would be an advantage).

- Be able to contextualise Maths topics and give a reason for their use.
- Identify knowledge gaps and plan individualised programmes of work.
- Track pupil progress and write reports.
- Keep records and complete paperwork as per the department requirements.
- Liaise with parents/ carers/ guardians as required.
- Provide termly targets for parents and attend parent meetings.
- Liaise with the SENDCo and other members of staff as necessary, including the Maths department.
- Liaise with outside agencies and attend meetings and training as required.
- Attend and contribute to the Learning Development Department meetings.

Professional Standards

- Support the aims and ethos of the school.
- Promote and safeguard the welfare of children and young persons for whom you are responsible and with whom you come into contact.
- Treat all members of the school community with respect and consideration.
- Attend staff meetings and Professional Development/ INSET days.
